### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Over the past several weeks the FMDAC Executive Board has been listening to some complaints and accusations that are not true. We have been ridiculed and have even been threatened. All this is being done by a few members and non members over the cancelling of the spring event in Apache Junction, AZ and I want to try and get the record straight.

A week or so before the deadline in Apache Junction, we only had 6 people registered for the event. We became concerned and discussed the possibility of cancelling the event. At that time no decision was made, only the possibility that if things didn't improve we would have no choice. Somehow word got out that the event was cancelled and that set off the controversy, but at that time it wasn't cancelled. About a week later when no other entries came in, only a few days before the deadline, we made the decision to cancel. After we cancelled the event, Mike Smith at that time Southwestern Chapter President, decided to have the event anyway but do it for the Chapter and on a smaller scale. At first the Executive Board didn't think that would

be a good idea because it would still look bad on the FMDAC if it wasn't a first class event. Mike assured us that everything would be done right, so the Executive Board decided to allow him to have the event and we would send him \$500.00 for added prizes. All was going well, and then all of a sudden, Mike cancelled the event and resigned as Chapter President. Since that time a firestorm, from a few members, started. We were threatened to be brought before the IRS for tax problems, we lost our 501C-3 status with the IRS and some of the officers have been accused of maybe taking money. One member even wanted me to call him so he could tape our conversation.

It continued with a member wanting our financial records for the past few years and we were told we were going to lose all our members and even be thrown out of the organization. All of this stems from not only the cancellation of the event but with us helping raise money for the Wisconsin Clubs to fight new law changes. I thought that was the FMDAC's job.

Let me assure you that none of the above is true. We have never lost our 501C-3 status nor are we in any trouble with the IRS. Jill, our National Treasurer, sent out regular Treasurer Reports to all the Officers, which can be seen by any member at anytime. We only have lost 3 members from the cancellation, but since that time we have picked up many, many new members and have picked up several new clubs. We will continue to fight for our rights and will take criticism, either bad or good.

On a positive note the FMDAC will once again sponsor a day at Treasure Week and Vic; Mid Atlantic Chapter President will put on a free chicken bar-b-cue for everyone that attends. He will also have a Big Chapter hunt on Sunday. Also flyers are out for the upcoming convention in Niagara Falls in October. Look forward to seeing everyone there. Have a Great Day and may you find many Treasures.

## Legislative Update

There are a lot of items on the table this year. Most have seen no movement. The only one that has "moved" is not one we were hoping would not go anywhere.

A bill in South Carolina was aimed straight at the relic hunting community. It created separate charges and penalties for trespassing on private property for the purpose of relic hunting. **YOU SHOULD NOT BE TRESPASSING.** However, there are already trespassing laws to cover it. The big problem is if you accidentally wander off the property to which you have permission to be on or become lost. Due to contacts from the relic hunting community a senate committee hearing was scheduled. Our Southeast Chapter President Art DiFilipo spoke at the hearing and fielded some questions from the committee. The bill passed, the good news is that the hearing, along with all the contacts was successful in getting a wording change. It now reads willful and malicious trespass. Of course we all know that it will be up to the person charged to prove their innocence.

Although this may seem like a small item it is one more hit on the hobby and a possible building block to more regulation.

The situation in New York City has seen no change. Same goes for Louisville, KY and the state of Wisconsin. The bills in both KY and WI to allow metal detecting in the state parks did not make it out of committee this year.

The Clean Water Restoration Act is still on the table. This one would give control of every drop of water in the country to the EPA and Corp of Engineers. Including what sits on private property. Oh yes and this also includes areas that are only seasonally wet.

The state of Washington is being attacked this year with a bill similar to the KY permit bill. It would require an archaeological permit from the state to dig on private property. A second bill would impose expensive permits for prospecting or any activity which "disturbs" the water.

You can follow these bills on the FMDAC website. Look at the legislation page and legislative forum. And watch your email for alerts when help is needed.

### **Strangers help find lost wedding ring in the surf**

A one-of-a-kind wedding ring slipped off Eric Rollins' finger Tuesday during his first ever surf lesson at Doheny Beach with his wife Debbie Toth Rollins. Despite two hours searching they couldn't find it. But a series of strange coincidences involving a retired U.S. Marine and a family of 14 from Utah brought it back Friday morning.

Debbie put an ad up on Craigslist Tuesday night. "White Gold Wedding Band – Men's Ring Inscription: Love U Long Time PS 112." Lucky for her, a 74-year-old retired Marine and metal detector hobbyist from Anaheim Hills was scrolling through the website's lost-and-found section.

Al Geisweidt said he almost didn't bother looking for the ring. "I normally don't go looking for men's rings because they're not as sentimental as women's rings," he said; "But she had a little something in her plea" "God bless you if you found it." And I think the Christian in me just surfaced."

So he called Debbie on Wednesday and decided to search for the ring Thursday morning starting around 5 a.m.

The same morning, Billie Mitchell of Utah County and her family were enjoying a summer vacation searching for sand dollars early in the morning, figuring they'd beat the other beachgoers to the prized shells. Billie found a rocky area covered in hermit crabs, and deep in the center of a bowl of rocks

sat the ring. She snatched it up, but wasn't quite sure what to do next.

"I hadn't thought about keeping the ring," she said. "I've wondered how I'm going to find the owner. We discussed taking it to a lifeguard but we figured that it would just end up in a pocket somewhere. We had no idea of how to find the owner."

To make matters worse, Billie and her family were heading home Saturday, and they had Disneyland and Universal Studios to visit in the meantime.

Around 5:45 a.m. Billie and Al ran into each other. Al had his headphones on, partly to listen to his metal detector. But he had other reasons too. "It keeps people from annoying me when I see them down at the beaches," he said. "I pretty much keep my nose down to the ground when I'm around people."

He said he searches early in the morning to avoid the "sun worshippers" and others around the beach but there was something about the way Billie approached him that made him listen. What it was isn't clear. "I don't know," he said. "I really don't know. To this day I don't know, because I normally don't talk to anybody."

Billie asked what he was searching for, but she said she was suspicious. "I told my friend with me, 'I bet he's out looking for that ring,'" she said. "He described the ring to me, but couldn't tell me what it said inside the ring. I was afraid he might have been there when I found the ring." "I told her it said, 'I love you forever,' or some mushy words," Al recalled.

Deciding not to take chances, Billie held onto the ring and got the phone number to Eric and Debbie from Al. Al felt a little dejected. "It took the wind right out of my sails," he said. "I packed my bag to go home."

A little later Thursday morning, Al called Debbie with the good news. "Believe me, you would not believe her or her husband in the background," Al said. "It was just hallelujahs and God praises. I haven't heard so much excitement."

He said it was a miracle it all came together. Billie was just glad to find the owner.

"It obviously was meant to go back to the owner," she said. "To be in the water and a full day later—with those tides—it surprises me. My husband said it had been raining and storming. For it to be close to the shore, it surprises me."

And to Debbie, who thought the ring was gone for good, the ring that symbolizes her love for Eric was preserved. "My husband and I were praying that we would have a miracle--because what would be the odds?" she said. "In our day and age we just don't hear people willing to do the right thing. People need to know that there's hope today."

Most within walking distance, where you can view the magnificent roaring falls, walk the cave of the winds and ride the Maid of the Mist (highly recommended). Kayak and barrel rides are frowned upon! There are also casinos on both sides and an outlet mall just a few minutes drive away. The hotel has plenty of guides and pamphlets for your review. You can also check out this website. <http://www.niagara-usa.com/> . Please take note that if you intend to cross the border into Canada **YOU MUST HAVE A PASSPORT** or an enhanced drivers license. Don't leave home without it.

## SEMINARS AND EXHIBITS

We will have displays by dealers, clubs, and individuals. Seminars on a variety of topics will run on Saturday. The display area will be open Friday evening and Saturday after the hunt is over. Registration will be open in the exhibit area on Friday and Saturday and at the hunt site on Saturday morning. Parking at the hotel is limited. There is a lot immediately across the street.
